

Necessity gave way to the creation of the Risk Management function






Castle and moat

More fiduciary responsibility made Risk Management more complex






Financial crises throughout history...





- Crisis of 1763 Amsterdam, collapse of Leendert Pieter de Neufville's bank, spread to Germany and Scandinavia
- Crisis of 1772-1773 London and Amsterdam, collapse of the bankers Neal, James, Fordyce and Down
- Panic of 1792 New York
- Panic of 1796-1797 Britain and U.S.

19th Century



- Panic of 1825 Britain, many banks failed, nearly including the Bank of England
- Panic of 1837 U.S. recession with bank failures, followed by a five-year depression
- Panic of 1847 U.K.
- Panic of 1857 U.S. recession with bank failures
- Panic of 1866 Europe
- Panic of 1873 U.S. recession with bank failures, followed by a four-year depression
- Panic of 1884 U.S. and Europe
- Panic of 1890 U.K. and Argentina
- Panic of 1893 U.S. recession with bank failures
- Australian banking crisis of 1893
- Panic of 1896 U.S. acute recession





Financial crises throughout history...

- Panic of 1901 a U.S. economic recession that started a fight for financial control of the Northern Pacific Railway
- Panic of 1907 U.S. economic recession with bank failures
- Shōwa Financial Crisis -1927 Japanese financial panic that resulted in mass bank failures across the Empire of Japan
- Great Depression the worst systemic banking crisis of the 20th century
- Secondary banking crisis of 1973-1975 in the U.K.
- Japanese asset price bubble (1986-2003)
- Savings and loan crisis of the 1980s and 1990s U.S.
- Finnish banking crisis of 1990s
- Swedish banking crisis of 1990s
- Rhode Island banking crisis of 1990s
- Peruvian banking crisis of 1992
- Venezuelan banking crisis of 1994
- 1997 Asian financial crisis
- 1998 collapse of long-term capital management
- 1998 Russian financial crisis
- Argentine economic crisis (1999-2002)
- 1998–99 Ecuador banking crisis



Then, it shifted from protection of life and commerce toward the merger of protection of life and commerce with evolution of capital markets




