
Key Findings— Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration

Countrywide

- After a period of moderation, indemnity duration is increasing again
- Estimated ultimate temporary total indemnity benefit duration has risen from 123 days in Accident Year 2006 to 141 days in Accident Year 2009





Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration Increase Accelerated Between December 2008 and June 2009



Countrywide Estimated Ultimate Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration Likely to Increase




Temporary Total Disability Components

- Temporary total indemnity duration decomposed into:
 - "Pure TTD" (claim does not transition to PPD)
 - The healing period of a PPD claim
- Decrease in overall duration from Accident Years 2002 to 2007 driven by the declining duration of the healing period

Countrywide Cumulative Frequency Distribution AY 2002 @ 84 Months



Decline in Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration in 2000s Driven by **Shorter Healing Period**






Florida Temporary Total **Indemnity Benefit Duration**



Florida Reform* Caused a Decline in Healing Period Duration


Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration Florida @ 36 months




Illinois Temporary Total **Indemnity Benefit Duration**






Pure TTD Major Reason for Increase


Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration Illinois @ 36 months






Tennessee Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration






Healing Period and Pure TTD Contribute to Duration Increase

Tennessee @ 36 months




Oregon Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration




Little Change to Healing Period or Pure TTD

Connecticut Temporary Total Indemnity Benefit Duration








Moderate Increase in Pure TTD Duration
