- Editorial issues: Need for new introduction, hyperlinks from Table of Contents to relevant sections, new bookmarks and updated glossary, need for consistent formatting between chapters.
- Literature review: The literature needs to be reviewed since it hasn't been done for the older chapters in several years. Chapters need to be updated to give additional guidance on issues that have recently become very important, such as ERM issues related to demonstrating capital adequacy to regulators and rating agencies.
- Examples: The group working on updating the loss reserving chapter will add examples, possibly based on simulated data from the CAS Loss Simulation Model.
