### Admissions Process: Recent Accomplishments

#### Launch of Future Fellows

- The Future Fellows brand has been expanded beyond the quarterly newsletter to represent the entire community of CAS candidates
- Plans for increasing engagement include new channels such as the new Future Fellows online community

#### Future Fellows Online Community

- A link has been added to the CAS homepage that directs candidates to a web portal with easy access to the wide range of CAS content applicable to them
- A dedicated page was created for news specific to Future Fellows

# Admissions Process: Recent Accomplishments (cont'd)

#### Syllabus Updates

- New Exam 8 paper on applied GLMs approved and ready for 2016
- Additional Exam 8 study note draft complete and undergoing final review for 2017
- Exam 5 ratemaking study note updates in process
- Exam S updated readings
- Transition from Exams ST and LC to Exam S completed as of May 2016
- CAS recognizing and responding to the importance of additional statistical knowledge and skills for future actuaries

### Admissions Process: Recent Accomplishments (cont'd)

#### Online Courses

Continuing to work with The Institutes to improve interface for online courses

#### Candidate Advisory Panel

- Formed to serve as an on-call survey response group that will facilitate future CAS candidate research activities
- Gives candidates volunteer opportunities and ability to have more say in the CAS
- Volunteers are now being accepted contact <a href="mboa@casact.org">mboa@casact.org</a>



- Improving exam quality
  - Expanded use of pre-testers
  - Formalization of roles related to the examination review process, identifying opportunities to leverage the expertise of syllabus volunteers and ensuring questions are reviewed by multiple volunteers
  - Actively working with consultants with expertise in specific areas of the syllabus
  - Re-examination of Bloom Taxonomy targets and learning objective statements to more closely align these two items



#### Acceleration of the appeals process

- Separation of the appeals windows between the associateship exams and the fellowship exams
- For the associateship exams, the window for submitting appeals to the CAS office has been shortened from four weeks to two weeks
- We have shortened the length of time between when the exam is administered and when the examiner's report is posted, and are taking steps to shorten it even further

### Administration of Exams 7-9 semi-annually

- Requires significant additional resources
- Has been deprioritized for the immediate future
- Will be reconsidered after other initiatives have been accomplished



#### Release of scores for passing candidates

- Admissions team has submitted a proposal to the Executive Council supporting this objective
- If change is made, it will apply only prospectively (i.e., passing scores will not be released for previously administered exams)
- Detailed score analysis by question would not be provided to passing candidates

#### Release of scores on CAS website

- Candidates will be able to log on to the CAS website and see the official grade report beginning with the fall 2016 sitting
- Electronic delivery of fail reports is being explored



#### Release of candidate answer sheets

- A challenging suggestion for the Admissions team to address, including significant logistical challenges
- The CAS is not aware of any other professional credentialing organization that currently maintains this practice
- Concern that the release of candidate papers could vastly increase the number of invalid appeals; releases of candidate papers with limitations or restrictions on appeals are being considered
- Release of graded or marked-up answer sheets is not being considered



- Exploring new exam delivery technologies
  - Working with vendors to try to identify a partner that can help to administer exams utilizing spreadsheets and word processing
  - Desire to administer exams in a computer-based environment, allowing the CAS to increase focus on testing application of concepts to actual datasets
  - Would also streamline the process of sending candidate responses to graders, grading candidate responses, and tabulating individual candidate scores; could result in a faster turn-around time between administration of the exam and release of passing candidate numbers



- Coordination with Staff Actuary
  - Reviewing drafts of exams for content and quality
  - Drafting questions for exams, particularly on new content
  - Monitoring educational structures in other actuarial organizations
  - Consideration of future actuarial education needs
  - Exploring and testing new exam delivery technologies
