Discipline Process

Complaint/Information

- "Complaint" or "information" to CIA Committee on Professional Conduct (CPC)
- Complaint is a specific allegation of bad conduct
- Information is not a formal complaint and may be anonymous
- Chair of CPC appoints sub-group of CPC to perform preliminary analysis of complaint/information



Preliminary Analysis

- Based on the sub-group's report, the CPC may:
 - Dismiss complaint (with or without letter of advice)
 - Charge member and issue a private admonishment (PA)
 - Appoint an Investigation Team (IT)



Investigation Team

- IT usually consists of two trained investigators (actuaries)
- Interviews complainant, respondent, and any other person IT feels may have relevant input, with appropriate confidentiality agreements obtained
- Requests and reviews any relevant documents
- Prepares report on findings for CPC



Investigation Team Report

- Based on the IT report, the CPC may:
 - Dismiss complaint (with or without letter of advice)
 - Confidential
 - Charge member and issue a PA
 - Confidential, PA kept in file for 5 years
 - Charge member and offer plea with recommendation of sanction
 - Notice of the charge and sanction sent to CIA Board and published to CIA membership
 - Charge member and refer to public Disciplinary Tribunal
 - Notice of charge and sanctions sent to CIA Board and published to appropriate regulators and to the public at large via newspaper



Disciplinary Tribunal

- Public hearing, like a trial
- Retired judge and two experienced actuaries
- Evidence presented by CPC lawyers and by respondent's lawyers
- Makes decision on guilt and sanction



Potential sanctions

- Public reprimand
- Fine and/or costs
- Suspension from CIA
- Expulsion from CIA
- Mandatory training
- Combination of above



Appeal Process

- The Discipline Tribunal decision is appealable by the Respondent
 - question of facts and question of law and jurisdiction
- Also appealable by the CPC
 - only on a question of law or jurisdiction
- The appeal tribunal is appointed by the CIA Board
 - 2 actuaries and a retired superior court judge
- Very strict timelines for appeals prescribed in Bylaws



Confidentiality and Focus

- Process confidential unless charge filed, then may become public
- CIA disciplinary process has its own focus and is independent of any other litigation
 - It follows its own path in cases of concurrent civil and/or criminal proceedings



Statistics

@ November 30, 2018

- ▶ 214 cases completed since 1992. Of these:
 - 132 cases dismissed
 - 3 resulted in a PA without going to an IT
 - > 79 cases referred to ITs
 - 38 resulted in no charges being filed
 - 41 cases resulted in charges being filed
 - □ 9 cases resulted in a PA
 - □ 8 cases resulted in admission of guilt and sanctions
 - □ 24 public disciplinary tribunals
 - □ 7 public reprimands, 13 suspensions, 1 withdrawal, 1 expulsion, 2 not guilty
 - □ 3 appeal tribunals subsequently appointed and all confirmed earlier finding
- ▶ 10 cases currently in progress



What's New?

What's New?

- Reporting of Criminal Convictions
 - ▶ Required since September 1, 2016
 - Initial review by Committee on Professionalism
 - Dismiss or refer to CPC for regular discipline process
 - So far, all have been dismissed
 - Operation of a vehicle while impaired
 - Conspiracy to distribute marijuana
